### **Section History:**

2024:

- The National Order of the Arrow Conference took place at CU Boulder, CO.

2022:

- The National Order of the Arrow Conference took place at Knoxville University, TN.

2020:

- The National Order of the Arrow Conference, originally planned for the summer of 2020, was canceled due to Covid-19 concerns
- In December 2020, the National OA Committee Chairman, Mike Hoffman, created the Project Magellan task force. This task force worked vigilantly to restructure the regional system they had in place.

2021:

- In October 2021, the National Order of the Arrow Committee adopted the plan the Magellan task force put together. This plan transformed the National and Regional OA as we know it. Most notably, it changed the regions from Southern, Central, Northeast, and Western to the Eastern and Gateway regions.
- During the National Planning Meeting on December 28, 2021, the Order of the Arrow officially started enacting the changes to the national and regional structures of the organization. Upon this implementation, Section SR-7B (Southern Region 7B) officially became Section E8 (Eastern 8). Our new section still consisted of the same six lodges: Tsoitsi Tsogalii #70, Occoneechee #104, Croatan #117, Wahissa #118, Nayawin Rar #296, and Klahican #331.

2008:

- On March 21, 2008, the Southern Region announced a realignment of the region from 7 areas to 9 areas. This would take effect concluding each of the areas Conclaves. However, SR-7B remained unaffected by these changes.

2001:

- On January 1, 2001, The National OA office started to realign the Southern Regions areas. Throughout all of the changes, SR-7B remained unaffected.

.1997:

- On January 1, 1997, the National OA office realigned the Southern Region areas. These changes took place following the conclusions of each area's 1997 Conclaves. Due to these changes, SR-7 was split into two separate areas, SR-7A (VA lodges), and SR-7B (NC lodges).
- The original lodges of SR-7 were Nawakwa 3, Tsoitsi Tsogalii 70, Occoneechee 104, Croatan 117, Wahissa 118, Itibapishe Iti Hollo 188, Nayawiñ RāR 296, Klahican 331, Wahunsenakah 333, Blue Heron 349, Catawba 459, and Eswau Huppeday 560. The realignments moved Nawakwa 3, Wahunsenakah 333, and Blue Heron 349 to the new SR-7A. The realignments also moved Tsoitsi Tsogalii 70, Occoneechee 104, Croatan 117, Wahissa 118, Nayawiñ RāR 296, and Klahican 331 to the new SR-7B. With all of these changes, we lost Itibapishe Iti Hollo 188, Catawba 459, and Eswau Huppeday 560 to section SR-5.

1995:

- Section 7 changes its name from "Old North State" to "Cardinal," the state bird shared by both NC and VA.
- Nayawiñ RāR Lodge #296 hosts the first Cardinal Conclave, SR-7's second-ever gathering.

1994:

- Tsalagi 163 (Cherokee) and Keyauwee 70 (Old North State) merged to form Tsoitsi Tsogalii Lodge 70.
- Cherokee Council (Tsalagi 163) merged into Old North State Council #70 in Greensboro, NC.
- SE-7 and SE-8 became SR-7.



- SR-7 held its first Conclave, with all ten lodges of SE-7 (Keyauwee 70, Occoneechee 104, Croatan 117, Wahissa 118, Tsalagi 163, Itibapishe Iti Hollo 188, Nayawiñ RāR 296, Klahican 331, Catawba 459, and Eswau Huppeday 560) and all five lodges of SE-8 (Nawakwa 3, Blue Heron 349, Kecoughtan 463, and Chanco 483) in attendance.

1993:

- The South Central and Southeast Regions were merged to form the brand new Southern Region, with the exception of the three lodges in NM.
- SE-7 hosted its final Conclave in 1993 at Camp Durant. The lodges in attendance included Keyauwee 70, Occoneechee 104, Croatan 117, Wahissa 118, Tsalagi 163, Itibapishe Iti Hollo 188, Nayawiñ RāR 296, Klahican 331, Catawba 459, and Eswau Huppeday 560.

1992:

- At the National BSA meeting held in 1992, it was announced that the region structure consisting of six would be consolidated into four.

1982:

- On January 1, 1982, the South Central and Southeastern adjusted their area boundaries.
- This caused Section SE-3A to be renamed SE-7. Along with this change, three lodges from SE-3B (newly SE-5) join the brand-new SE-7: Itibapishe Iti Hollo 188, Catawba 459, and Eswau Huppeday 560.

1973:

- The Section Operation reorganized the OA districts into six OA regions. These regions included the East Central, North Central, Northeast, Southeast, South Central, and Western.
- This was roughly around the time that Area conferences started to be referred to as “Conclaves.”
- Via these regional changes, Area 6-A was now a part of Section SE-3A. No changes to the lodges within our section/area occurred. SE-3A was referred to as “Old North State”.

1953:

- Tsali 134, Itibapishe Iti Hollo 188, and Catawba 459 were lost to Area 6-B.
- New Area 6-A consisted of Tali Taktaki 70, Occoneechee 104, Croatan 117, Wahissa 118, Tslagi 163, Uwharrie 208, Nayawiñ RāR 296, and Klahican 331.

1952:

- Nayawiñ RāR 296 held the first Area 6-A Fellowship as Camp Tuscorara.

1950-1951:

- No Area 6-A Fellowships were held between the years of 1950-1951.

1949:

- Area I met for the last time at Camp Uwharrie following the area changes.

1948:

- In September of 1948, Areas I, J, and Z were merged into Region 6.
- Area 6-A was created based on Area I. Area 6-A was one of the four areas in Region 6. The new Area 6-A consisted of Tali Taktaki 70, Occoneechee 104, Croatan 117, Wahissa 118, Tsali 134, Tslagi 163, Itibapishe Iti Hollo 188, Uwharrie 208, Nayawiñ RāR 296, Klahican 331, and Catawba 459

1946:

- Klahican 331 joined Area I

1943:

- The lodges of North Carolina were split off from Area H to form Area I. This area included Ali Taktaki 70, Occoneechee 104, Croatan 117, Wahissa 118, Tsali 134, Tslagi 163, Itiapishe Iti Hollo 188, and Uwharrie 208.
- Nayawiñ RāR 296 joined Area I

1910s:

- The three OA districts became six districts. Each district consisted of a few Areas, with 26 total.
